- Neonatal intensive care units –late seventies and early eighties at all metro cities
- 1989- Formal training programs, DM in neonatology started at PGIMER,
 Chandigarh
- 1989-92- Pediatric Intensive Care Units (PICUs) at PGIMER, Chandigarh; SGRH, Delhi; Hinduja Hospital, Mumba;, Child Trust Hospital, Chennai.
- 1995- IAP- PALS course started all over India and first PALS instructor Course held at Chandigarh, National Convener Dr. S Singhi
- Few PICUs, managed on an adhoc basis by physicians continue to grow
- In 1996 survey- 21 PICUs, 2-8 bed size, only 19 had Ventilators, Labs in 20, ABGs in 6
- 2002-03- 70 PICUs, 2-12 beds, only 26 medical colleges, monitors in 61, SpO₂ monitor in 66, ventilators in 58
- 2004 No. of PICUs crosses 100 mark
- 2017- The IAP PIC chapter has 1500 members
